Try the Am chord with the C and F chords. Use the rests to move your fingers.

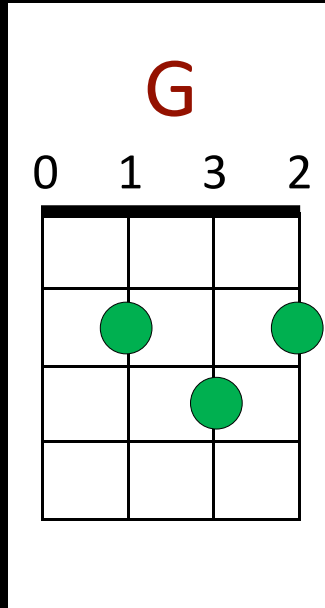




STOP
