



Dm Chord

D minor is a three-finger chord, one that fits fairly comfortable on the fretboard. You can create this chord by starting with an F chord (two yellow stickers) then adding the third finger to the third string, second fret.





Em Chord

The Em chord is a three-finger chord that fits very comfortably on the fret board. First finger, first string, second fret; second finger, second string, third fret; third finger, third string, fourth fret.





The A chord is a two-finger chord that is quite easy to reach. First finger, third string, first fret; second finger, fourth string, second fret.







